 - Ken Burke: I sent my notes, MCA will be publishing the video recordings
 - Elaine Abbott:
 - 4Directions and SCEC were awarded rural tribal partner grants digital literacy and inclusion
 - Elaine is now full-time on broadband
 - Details are being ironed out
 - Melissa Mitchell is Youth Voices core partner
 - Tasks:
 - Infrastructue planning, implementation, digital equity and literacy
 - Contributing to state-wide plan
 - Chris Waite is doing tribal communities
 - Jeanne Peacock: Will you have additional resources for Washington county for literacy?
 - Elaine Abbott: One resource for Washington county, Rachel Williams, lives in Eastport
 - Dan Sullivan: Highlights
 - They lost his slide deck at MCA,
 - MCA shifted focus, RDOF issue is causing them to be more selective
 - Eastport doesn't have RDOF conflict
 - Going as a group of communities is a plus to MCA (Perry, Sipayik, Eastport)
 - Sertex (https://www.sertexbroadband.com/), from CT, is meeting with Tim McAfee (Pioneer) and Dan Sullivan to discuss possibilities and details, willing to come to Maine to implement
 - RDOF bid by CCI/Consolidated Communications has put a drag on funding for Charlotte implementation
 - Dan Sullivan talking with CCI to see if they'll release the hold
 - RDOF bid winners nly have to build out 95% of awarded RDOF towns some will by definiton be left out, and grant funds will likely be unavailable at that time
 - Elaine Abbott: Perry, Eastport, and Sipayik aren't hampered by RDOF awards to third parties
 - Chris Waite: You can go "through" an RDOF-locked community, but can't serve them
 - Redzone Wireless was making some pretty outrageous claims aboutwireless connectivity
 - Misinformation about wireless reliability
 - Get ducks in a row to get in the queue to get build grants
 - Spectrum is providing misinformation in Caribou, causing a lot of friction
 - 4.Mark Wigley: Pioneer (Tim McAfee) agreed to do a "desktop" survey to provide working costs for January's city council workshop
 - How soon would city have to begin to repay a loan/bond?
 - Elaine Abbott: Work with the banks to sort this
 - Dan Sullivan: Establish line of credit, then go to long-term note
 - Banks are very interested in helping towns with broadband
 - Start talking with banks NOW, include bond options. Action
 - Elaine Abbott: You need an attorney who structures the bonds
 - Ken Burke: We should ask council permission, ask for partnership with city treasurer. Action
- 5. Dan Sullivan: Axiom is now working to get bond money, will pay back some amount of money to a town if they (Axiom) are the **sole provider**
 - Talking with Tim McAfee, an inspector came to talk with him for 3 hours about Indian township build

- Corning has insinuated the insertion of a "strand" support cable, Corning ice-load specification. Maine considered "heavy". No fiber run over 150 feet.
- Tim McAfee waiting for Spector and MCA response.
- MCA is the source of the possible new requirement (use of strand)
- Chris Waite: May require an 8-wire to support the drop to home/business. Or customer owns the drop. Not likely to go anywhere.

6. Jeanne Peacock:

- A speaker said Maine is in the top ten of states (middle of the top ten) for broadband connectivity efforts
- Ken Burke: One of the groups mentioned they don't provide anything but Internet connectivity. Customer subscribes for other streaming services.
 - Dan Sullivan: Death knell of the cable industry
 - Elaine Abbott: Podcast, POTS and PANS (https://potsandpansbyccg.com/), Doug Dawson, CCG
 Consulting millions dropping cable
 - A Repeat Performance for Cable TV 3Q22
 - NDEC has a "Cutting the Cord" class to teach people how to do this
 - Dan Sullian: As a consumer, buy only what you want to use
